LYCÉE'S CURRICULUM

In order to offer high school students a diversified curriculum and ambitious programs, students have access to a wide choice of specialties and options in Première and Terminale. Beyond the mandatory common teaching, students get to choose 3 specialty courses in Première and pursue only 2 of them in Terminale.

EQUIVALENCES

How to read the report cards

The table of disciplines (p.4) and the table of equivalence below contain all the information necessary for a good understanding of our Report Cards.

Students are being evaluated for the baccalaureate throughout the Première and Terminale years and at the time of the final exams.

- The Lycée Claudel operates in semesters rather than terms: 1st semester from September to January, 2nd semester from January to June.
- The number followed by a letter at the top of the report card corresponds to the student's grade level and class color (e.g. 1B = Première Blue or Grade 11 Blue).
- The reference level in English for Terminale students is C1 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
- The French rating scale from 0 to 20 differs from North American high schools rating scale from 0 to 100%. Most universities are familiar with the French grading scale and evaluate students applications on the basis of the official report cards marked out of 20.
- There is no credit for each course taken, nor is there a ranking.
- Volunteer activities are not a requirement at Lycée Claudel.

THE FRENCH BACCALAUREATE

Presentation

The French Baccalaureate is delivered by the French Ministry of Education. Created in 1808, the French baccalaureate diploma :

- marks the successful completion of secondary school,
- opens access to higher education in France and around the world.

The baccalaureate is a diploma based on ambitious, rigorous programs that are open to the world. It promotes the ability to think and argue in a structured way, both in writing and orally. The baccalaureate also evaluates our students on their solid general culture acquired during their schooling. As a result, our students enter higher education prepared and confident about the new challenges that await them.

Evaluation procedures

The diploma is obtained when the general average of 10/20 is reached. The student can receive a mention according to the average obtained in the baccalaureate:

Very good ($\Rightarrow 16/20$), Good ($\Rightarrow 14/20$), Fairly good ($\Rightarrow 12/20$).

- **Continuous assessment** corresponds to the assessments during the year of Première and Terminale.
- **Final exams:** 1 early exam in Première (written and oral French), 4 final exams in Terminale (2 specialty exams, 1 philosophy exam, and 1 major oral exam based on the specialty teachings). See diagram Page 7 for more details.

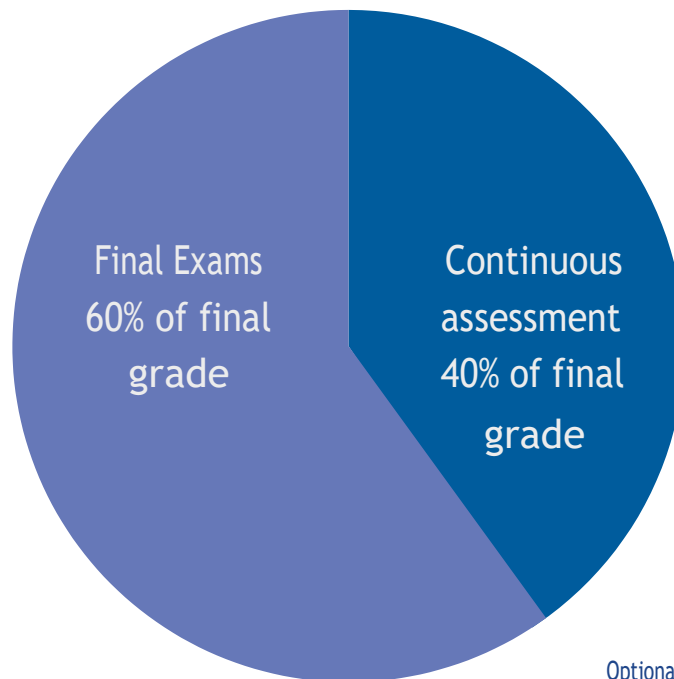
Distribution of the Baccalaureate Tests and Assessments over Première (Gr11) and Terminale (Gr12)

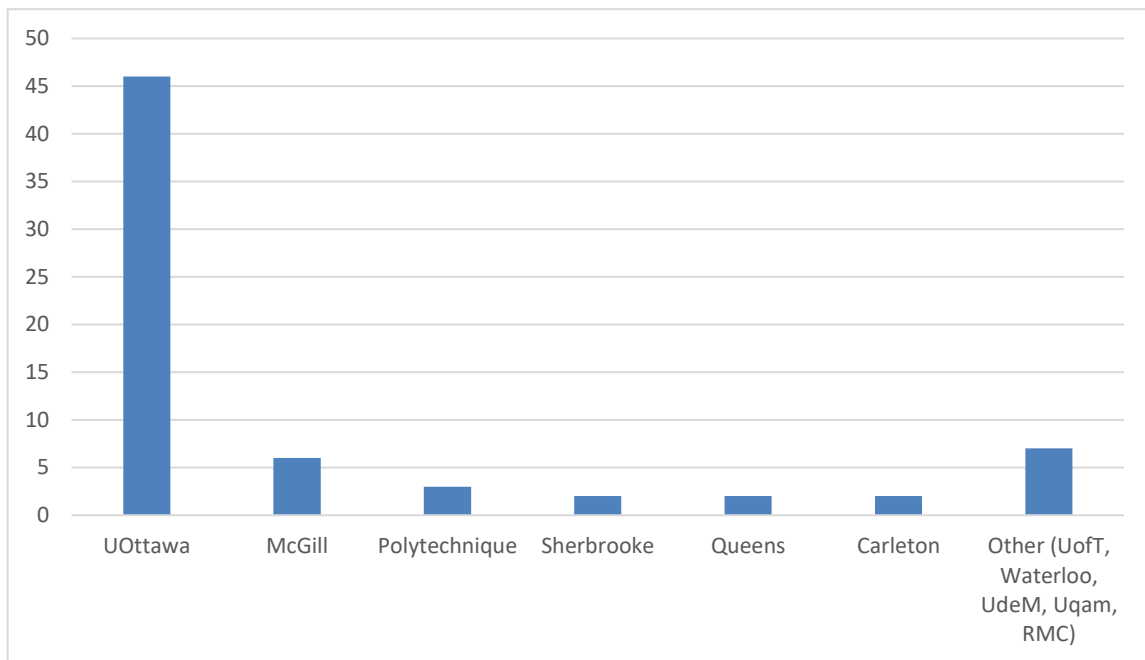

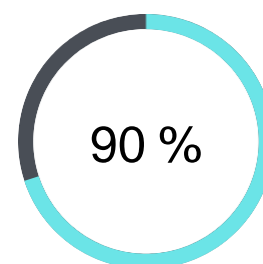
